Letting our light shine at Bible camp



Many of you have fond memories and lives that were transformed by attending summer Bible camp in your youth. Consider, then, the impact that experience is having when Mission

UpReach organizes a similar camp setting and invites 80 children from Honduras to participate. We held such a gathering, our third annual camp, in January in Corquín, Honduras.

The camp was energized and in collaboration with a group of camp counselors from Camp Deer Run in Winnsboro, Texas. We appreciate Ty Ford, director at Camp Deer Run, and his volunteers who provided a critical role in a successful camp. Laura Waldron served as the Honduran director this year.

Our theme this year was "Hágase la Luz" (essentially "let there be light; as you are the light.").



The children learned how God is the light of the world and about their role reflecting that light in a world of darkness.

The children who participated in the camp were made up of children from the congregation in Belén as well as select children from two of the schools in which our DESEO program works. For many of these children this was their third year to experience bible camp, something they eagerly anticipate each year. This is just one more way we are building The John 1010 Generation.

We had our fourth annual planning meeting in January. During the three day conclave, our entire staff (now numbering more than 65 members) came together to celebrate the accomplishments of 2016 and share the plans and goals for 2017. This meeting assures that all resources are deployed toward the core mission of MUR to realize 1,010 new congregations in this region during this generation.

Sign up to help bring clean water to Hondurans

Identifying sources of potable water is a huge challenge in the developing world. In fact, Water. org (a reputable nonprofit providing water in Africa) states that the developing world does not stand a chance without clean water. Without safe water, disease spreads, safety is compromised, and education is elusive. The lack of access to safe water is deadly, dangerous, and a major obstacle. With safe water, there is health, safety, and opportunity.

We reported in December that after seven years of planning, Mission UpReach is ready to launch our water-well drilling program. A caravan of equipment that includes a rotary drilling rig and all the required support equipment is currently en route to Honduras. We plan to drill our first water well at The Moses Project property during May. The pilot well will be drilled over a period of two weeks, utilizing the resources provided by two, consecutive mission brigades from the USA.

One team will begin on May 6 and the second on May 13. These teams will be comprised of individuals arriving from all over the USA. The project will be very demanding (physically and with long hours); however, we know these brigades are also great fun as people come together from all walks of life and regions to serve in this ministry.

with us through 2017 with a goal of supporting the successful launch of our new deaf school. Abbie will




be a sign language translator in the adult classes that commence in February and a great encouragement to those in the deaf community here. We ask that you pray for this new ministry as it begins.

We note that both the children's chorus and the deaf school were not fully funded during our annual fundraising campaign, so MUR is seeking additional donations to assure that these ministries continue.


