New employees bless DESEO, ESPERO teams



Our DESEO program kicked off again this month! DESEO is our school outreach program that provides approved instruction in public schools and teaches morals, values, and faith. This formal instruction is enhanced with extracurricular activities such as UpWard basketball, tutoring, our new children's chorus, our new deaf school and a variety of other projects! In addition to the 'learning' that occurs, children and their family get to know MUR at our church buildings and on a personal, Christian level. This is very important to our evangelistic efforts.

Our total DESEO team has grown to 11 members and will work in 16 schools in and around the city of Santa Rosa. Two new team members Brittany and Hector join our DESEO instruction team. Brittany White (*pictured right*) joined her aunt and uncle, Mike and Kris Bridges, last year and will be working with our DESEO team. Hector, a member of one of our local congregations, will round out the DESEO team.

We have added 5 DESEO schools in the Corquin area

Word of the Month

"Self-led" is the MUR understanding that leadership in a local congregation is best served by trained and equipped indigenous Christian workers. Self-led congregations have proven more sustainable than those where outside funding comes to the community this term. Corquin is a community about an hour from Santa Rosa and is the region of focus of the Bridges family. Our team is helping us open doors in that community to spread the word of God.

ESPERO, which is our new school for the deaf, has added two team members. In Santa Rosa, and in Honduras generally, the deaf community is offered very few opportunities for advancement and education. This prejudice leads to marginalization and a portion of society who is isolated from the rest of the community. This school will be transformational for a group of people who have never been acknowledged in or have not benefited from their society. We welcome Cindy and Mirian to our ESPERO School for the Deaf. They will serve as a licensed teacher and teacher's assistant, respectively. This school has not yet received adequate funding to meet all of our goals. 
Meet Hugo
