## Snellville church brings three teams

In early June the **Snellville Church** of Christ from Snellville, GA came to work with Mission UpReach, bringing three different teams.

One team focused on meeting basic medical needs in 5 different schools, giving each student in the school a medical consult and any needed medications. They were able to serve more than 500 children during the week.

A second team provided a VBS based on the story of Esther emphasizing the value of courage. They were able to serve over 600 children during the week. The same group was able to take their VBS to a school where the Snellville church members have sponsored children in our DESEO Project, child sponsorship program. It was very special to be able to personally connect with the children they support monthly and see them in their school environment. This same group spent their afternoons visiting a local eldercare facility where they shared an afternoon snack and played games. Another afternoon they went to the local hospital and served homemade chicken soup to several patients.

The third team focused on the ongoing construction of a cabin at our Moses Project farm. They funded and labored to place siding on the cabin, moving it closer to completion.

The Snellville church has a longstanding relationship with Mission UpReach that we value highly. The financial support as well as the annual visits with eager servants combine to contribute to the on-going growth of our efforts in Honduras.









## **Combining churches for success**

The Pine Tree Church of **Christ** has been a vital part of Mission UpReach's success since our beginning in 2008. Their financial support as well as sending multiple teams of short-term workers has been consistent.

This month the Pine Tree Church of Christ (Longview, TX) joined with the West **Broward Church of Christ** (Plantation, FL) to form a wonderful medical team providing basic medical consults, medication, tooth extractions, eye exams, and glasses as needed. They were able to serve over 900 people during their short week here

in Honduras. The cohesion and collaboration of the two churches was productive and impactful.

The West Broward church has visited before, but this time more of them came to work and serve. The attitudes of service and the energy for hard work not only resulted in serving a large number of people but also demonstrated to the community the love of Christ. We see consistently the opening of doors to evangelize in a community after such efforts.

**University Church of Christ** and Montrose Church of Christ combined teams to serve in Puerta Belen, Lempira this month to meet the medical needs of a very poor sector of the country. A beautiful team of 22 joined forces successfully to lovingly and professionally serve the physical needs of some of the neediest

The church in Puerta Belen is relatively new but growing. They have recently built their own building that we were able to utilize for the brigade. They involved the church members in inviting folks to the brigade, reaching out to some of the most remote and needy communities surrounding their church. Almost 900 people responded to the invitation for the medical brigade.

This team decided to bring, in addition to the usual vitamins and medications, toys and personal hygiene items to give to each person who came through the clinic. That little touch added a wonderful element to the brigade. While the gifts were simple, they were so appreciated by the recipients. Our goal at Mission UpReach with visiting medical teams is to tap into the neediest of the community. All that come through meet that criteria but sometimes, as was the case with Puerta Belen, we tap into a sector of the population that is very evidently in need. It makes the usual satisfaction of serving others even greater.

# **Burnt Hickory returns to Crucitas**





The **Burnt Hickory Church** of Christ from Marietta, GA returned to a village by the name of Crucitas for the 5th year in a row. The community is home to a church plant that was initially supported by Mission UpReach but has now grown to full independence.

While the community is very close to Santa Rosa, it has the feel of a very remote village. The brigade serves people from even more distant villages, some walking as much as two hours to get to the brigade. We always utilize the local church building for the brigade, raising the esteem of the church in the Crucitas community as well as the surrounding communities.

In our medical brigades we always offer a basic parasite treatment to those who haven't been treated in the past 6 months. When asked if they have been treated in the past 6 moths, the majority responded that they were treated last year in the same brigade, demonstrating the fact that we serve mostly the same 900 people each year. It also demonstrates their confidence in allowing us to serve them.

We are grateful to Burnt Hickory and their ongoing support for Mission UpReach.

## School for parents studies Christian Marriage

One of the ways we have expanded our DESEO outreach in 2019 is by offering to provide the speakers for the monthly school for parents that is required by the government in each elementary school. This month Phil Waldron was the feature speaker and spoke on the topic of "Christian Marriage."

He was able to speak at 4 different schools during June to a group of parents (mostly mothers) who were eager to listen to God's plan for marriage. In a society that consists mostly of broken marriages and free unions, the message is needed and was well received.

We see this outreach as one more opportunity to share the Good News of Jesus and all He offers to our broken lives.
