Now if only you were able to come and visit with us here in Santa Rosa and you were to ask, "what all is God doing in and through Mission

UpReach to justify the huge investment that you are making every year?" I think I would respond similarly to Jesus as he spoke to John's disciples.

I would say, "many, many people are being healed through medical interventions. The deaf are being given language and taught to read and write. And children, youth and adults are being taught the Way that leads to Eternal Life. And always, day and night, the Gospel is being

preached to the poor."

It is the Holy Spirit that "convicts the world of sin." We know that it is not our doing that brings about transformation in people's lives. We are very conscious of the fact that we get to be part of what God's Spirit is doing here. # Closing ceremonies for ESPERO



Can you believe we just completed our 6th year of our deaf school for adults? Every year we have a closing ceremony honoring all students with a special emphasis on the graduating 6th graders. This year's 6th grade class consisted of two. We have three students who have completed the 8th grade now and will be our first to graduate next year in what Honduras considers to be the first "real" graduation in the process of education.

This coming year we will continue with the 19 students from this year with the possibility of 24 new students. Our space is running out, a wonderful but challenging issue. We have some ideas for how to continue to grow while taking full advantage of our space challenges. We are also thrilled to announce that the Legacy Church in Texas has donated funds to assist in purchasing a small bus specifically for our school. We are also excited to share that this coming year we will have three deaf staff members, something that seemed impossible when we first began.

This ministry is thriving and growing because we dared to dream and proceeded in faith. This population is so worthy of our investment, and we hope you will continue to help us keep the school open and growing.

#### **More Weddings**

We were so happy to witness the marriage of two of our young couples this past month. Many of you know that Mission UpReach, over the course of the last 13+ years, has assisted more than 100 couples legalize their relationships. Free union relationships (which are couples living together in what our culture would describe as a common law marriage) are so much a part of the culture and are "normal" for so many families.

The legal process is complicated and costly, providing a large obstacle for many couples with limited income. We have reached a huge milestone this year in that our local congregation paid for the costs related to the legal fees as well as the church wedding. This is a great example of how the work of Mission UpReach is becoming sustainable.

The truth is that everything that Mission UpReach does, through our programs and ministries, is focused on building up the Church and helping her become the transforming force that God intends it to be in the local community.

In this case, creating a "counter-culture" wave of vocally and visibly honoring legal-marriage as God's best design for the family and the community, has taken 13 years of non-stop promotions.

You would have been just as excited as we were to see this beautiful ceremony take place. The church building was decorated, a full meal was served, and a beautiful wedding cake was shared at the end. Being

able to participate in helping these young couples do what pleases the Lord is an incredible blessing for our local church. And it is always a wonderful experience seeing the women glow as they experience the fulfillment of their dream of being a bride. Both grooms are graduates from our Moses Project and are now active members of our local church. May God be praised!

#### **Another Birthday**

Through our DESEO Project sponsorships we can bring joy and

grade last month and has therefore graduated from the DESEO Project. Due to the high drop-out rate in young students, the DESEO Project aims to support families with school supplies, uniforms and free after school programs in order to help keep kids in school for their basic education and set them on a path for success.

Guadalupe Ruelas, who is the Director of Casa Alianza, an NGO in Honduras, says, "We often talk about underdevelopment and marginalized people as if they're a minority, but in Honduras, the marginalized are a large majority." According to UNICEF, 77% of Honduran children belong to poor families. "There are more children than adults living in poverty," she says. "Honduras lags far behind international standards because approximately four million (49%) school-aged children don't go to school."

Due to the continued support of Jareth's sponsor through the years, Jareth was able to stay in school and complete his elementary education. He is now literate and focused on creating a successful future for himself. Happy birthday, Jareth! We are proud of you!







# A note from Donna

Often, I am overwhelmed with fear. That seems to happen often as we pray and hope with anticipation for the needed funding to continue our work. I know it's God who provides, at least I know

that's the correct response. But can I be human for a moment?

For reasons we may never understand, God has chosen to use the generosity of humans to carry out His works on the earth. I wish most days that it wasn't that way. Fortunately for Mission UpReach, Phil is tireless in asking and seeking. If it were up to me, we would be in starvation mode. Being employed by Mission UpReach allows them to pay their way through the University, something they would not be able to do otherwise. This helps to launch them into the world as professionals once their time with DESEO ends. Some of them find a role in the mission, and some find jobs in the community. So, our efforts here are multi-layered and the impact is challenging to measure.

And did I mention that these young men and women develop leadership and teaching skills that benefit the local church? It truly is overwhelming to think of what God has done and is doing here in western Honduras. Thank you for allowing me to be vulnerable and honest. I suppose this is my personal way of inviting you to help us. Allow God to use you and join us in impacting the lives of so many. And please ask our Sovereign Lord to continue to provide what we need, even when our faith is weak.
