Annual DESEO teachers' meeting

A large part of serving our community well is keeping our hand on the pulse of the needs of the people we serve. Our DESEO Program serves many schools throughout our area on a weekly basis and our regular presence helps us serve well. But in addition, we hold an annual meeting with the teachers from each of the schools we visit to get their feedback as well as thank them for the way they have welcomed DESEO into their schools. This year, 37 teachers were in attendance where we were able to discuss each school's achievements and give out awards. In the discussion time, the teachers expressed how impressed they are with how our



team comes to the schools very prepared and always with a unique and dynamic way to teach the values. The children don't want to miss school the day that DESEO is coming and wait with eagerness for the DESEO bus to arrive with the team. They've also observed improved behaviors in their students overall. Each teacher expressed how it's a blessing for DESEO to come to their schools and provide a fun educational experience that is uniquely different from their day-to-day studies. The afternoon tutoring the children receive has kept many kids in school and has been an incredible asset to the teachers, especially for the students who struggle. In Crucitas, where we have the best participation in tutoring, there are students who must walk one hour to get to tutoring and then one hour home, but they never want to miss out! The importance of a partnership with the teachers at each school cannot be overstated. Their gratitude and suggestions make our program even more effective each new year. We can't wait for the 2024 school year!

Closing celebrations for 2023



The end of the Honduran school year is already here and with that comes the DESEO closing celebration. The team visited each of the 17 schools we worked in this school year and said farewells to some 1,000 students they impacted. Our hope is that most of these goodbyes are just "see you later" because we will see them next year or they will attend our church or come to

our annual Kids' Camp. But the reality is that some kids may be pulled from school to work so they can help their families financially. Some kids will be graduating from 6th grade and will be leaving our DESEO Program, but our prayer is that they will be able to continue their education. With the closing of DESEO, we also had our last game for the UPWARD basketball program for this season. Parents and teachers alike are invited to the big final games and trophies, awards, and t-shirts were given out at the end acknowledging all the kids' hard work and improvement. We had 50 kids from six different schools participate in the afternoon basketball program this year.





Update on the Moses Project



In addition to a focus on their high school classes, the teens at the Moses Project have gotten to participate in a variety of other dynamic activities.

1) They have been cultivating a garden and using the sales of the produce to save for the seeds to grow next year's garden.

2) Due to a generous donor, we have been able to purchase a new laptop for each of the boys at the Project so they may complete daily Rosetta Stone English classes. Many of the boys list learning English as their favorite activity. Before, there were only 2 computers available in the common area, so they had to take turns doing schoolwork. But now they will be able to give more attention to their individual English language studies as well as learning how to use computers effectively, which is an important marketable skill.

3) We recently began a STEM club (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) at the Moses Project. Traditional public education in Honduras focuses on rote memorization and copying from the board, but hands-on, engaging activities are necessary to spark an interest in learning that students will carry with them. They will be participating in fun activities like building spaghetti towers, bridge competitions, programming, and electrical circuits. We're excited to develop these young men to be problem solvers, innovators, inventors, and critical thinkers!

4) The STEM Club time is also paired with soccer training. The boys have such a passion for soccer but have never learned drills or received any training to develop their skills. Approaching a game with discipline and being able to see measured improvement is a big motivator for these young men!



Thank you for your continued support of this program, and we look forward to impacting more lives each year as the boys are offered life-changing opportunities to better their future.
